### REQUIREMENTS Fabrics from the Small Things Rivers and Creeks collection:

- 1. SM76.1 Beavers on river mist 3/8yd 40cm
- 2. SM76.3 Beavers on ink 3/3yd 40cm
- 3. SM77.1 Frogs and toads on cream <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 4. SM77.2 Frogs and toads on light green <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 5. SM78.1 Otters on muted blue <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 6. SM78.3 Otters on midblue 3/8yd 40cm
- 7. SM79.1 Herons and kingfisher on cream 3/8yd 40cm
- 8. SM79.3 Herons and kingfisher on dark 3/3 yd 40cm
- 9. SM80.1 Ducks and geese on green cream <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>yd 40cm
- 10. SM80.3 Ducks and geese on green <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 11. BB02 Cream 1yd 1m
- 12. BB29 Indigo 1yd 1m

Wadding and backing 62" x 70"

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go. You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

### Cutting

#### From each of the fabrics 1 to 10 you need to cut

6 x 4<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 4<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" cut in half diagonally once - blocks

7 x 41/2" x 41/2" blocks & borders

#### From fabric 11 cut

11 x 4<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 4<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" cut in half diagonally once - blocks

42 x 4½" x 4½"

24 x 2<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 2<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" cut in half diagonally once - border

#### From fabric 12 cut

 $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $62\frac{1}{2}$ " outer border - sides

 $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 56<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" outer border - top & bottom

 $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $52\frac{1}{2}$ " inner border - sides

 $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 46<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" inner border - top & bottom

 $8 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing in middle border

**Border block** 

Look at the main diagram for the fabric lay out.

# Quilt block 1.

On the outer edge of the quilt centre, you will stitch together a background triangle with a pattern fabric triangle to make the square.

You need 22 blocks in total.

# Quilt block 2.

On this you will sew two pattern fabric triangles together to make a square. Look at witch fabrics with go together.

You need 49 blocks in total.

# Border block.

Stitch a triangle to the opposite sides of the square. Fold each in half so this will help to match them up before sewing into place. Do the same to the other two triangles to complete the block.

You need 12 in total.

# Making up the quilt.

Lay out all the blocks and fabric squares as in the main diagram. Sew your rows together, pressing the seams in the opposite way each time as this will help when you stitch your rows together.

Stitch the rows together to complete the quilt centre. I sew half of the rows together.

Then do the same with the other half of rows and then stitch the two together.

## Inner border

Stitch inner border strips to the quilt of fabric 12 to the sides, press.

Next sew the top and bottom strips to the quilt.

# Middle border

Lay out all the pieces as in the main diagram. For the sides sew 13 squares together adding a strip of fabric 12 at each end. Sew to the quilt

For the top and bottom you with stitch a strip and then the square of fabric. Stitch this to the quilt.

# Outer border

Sew the sides strips of fabric 12 to the quilt. Now stitch the top and bottom to complete the quilt top.

# Quilting and binding

Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine a pattern to match the quilt.

Maybe flowers. Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

# Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 12 for binding the quilt.

#### REQUIREMENTS Fabrics from the Small Things Rivers and Creeks collection:

- 1. SM76.1 Beavers on river mist 3/3yd 40cm
- 2. SM76.2 Beavers on warm grey <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 3. SM77.1 Frogs and toads on cream <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 4. SM77.3 Frogs and toads on swamp 3/3yd 40cm
- 5. SM78.1 Otters on muted blue <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 6. SM78.2 Otters on watergreen <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 7. SM79.2 Herons and kingfisher on light blue 3/3 yd 40cm
- 8. SM79.3 Herons and kingfisher on dark <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 9. SM80.1 Ducks and geese on green cream <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 10. SM80.2 Ducks and geese on sunny blue <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>yd 40cm
- 11. BB04 Latte 1yd 1m
- 12. BB10 Wiltshire green 1yd 1m

Wadding and backing 62" x 70"

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go. You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

### Cutting

#### From each of the fabrics 1 to 10 you need to cut

6 x 4<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 4<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" cut in half diagonally once - blocks

7 x 41/2" x 41/2" blocks & borders

#### From fabric 11 cut

11 x 4<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 4<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" cut in half diagonally once - blocks

42 x 4½" x 4½"

24 x 2<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 2<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" cut in half diagonally once - border

#### From fabric 12 cut

 $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $62\frac{1}{2}$ " outer border - sides

 $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 56<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" outer border - top & bottom

 $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 52<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" inner border - sides

2 x 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 46<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" inner border - top & bottom

8 x 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" sashing in middle border

# Making up the blocks

Look at the main diagram for the fabric lay out.

## Quilt block 1.

On the outer edge of the quilt centre, you will stitch together a background triangle with a pattern fabric triangle to make the square.

You need 22 blocks in total.

# Quilt block 2.

On this you will sew two pattern fabric triangles together to make a square. Look at witch fabrics with go together.

You need 49 blocks in total.

# Border block.

Stitch a triangle to the opposite sides of the square. Fold each in half so this will help to match them up before sewing into place. Do the same to the other two triangles to complete the block.

You need 12 in total.

# Making up the quilt.

Lay out all the blocks and fabric squares as in the main diagram. Sew your rows together, pressing the seams in the opposite way each time as this will help when you stitch your rows together.

Stitch the rows together to complete the quilt centre. I sew half of the rows together.

Then do the same with the other half of rows and then stitch the two together.

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## Inner border

Stitch inner border strips to the quilt of fabric 12 to the sides, press.

Next sew the top and bottom strips to the quilt.

# Middle border

Lay out all the pieces as in the main diagram. For the sides sew 13 squares together adding a strip of fabric 12 at each end. Sew to the quilt

For the top and bottom you with stitch a strip and then the square of fabric. Stitch this to the quilt.

# Outer border

Sew the sides strips of fabric 12 to the quilt. Now stitch the top and bottom to complete the quilt top.

# Quilting and binding

Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine a pattern to match the quilt.

Maybe flowers. Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

# Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 12 for binding the quilt.



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
