- 1. A882.A Witchy woods on Halloween orange 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>yd 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>m
- 2. A883.B Terrifying ticking stripe on spooky purple fat 1/4
- 3. A884B Floral cobwebs on grey fat  $\frac{1}{4}$
- 4. A885C Spooky friends on black fat 1/4
- 5. A886B Witches hats on Halloween orange fat 1/4
- 6. BB03 Light grey ¾yd ¾m
- 7. BB030 Black 1/8yd 80cm
- 8. BB027 Royal purple <sup>5</sup>⁄<sub>8</sub>yd <sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>2</sub>m

Wadding and backing 58" x 58"

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

## Cutting

### From fabric 1 cut

2 x 2" x 50<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" top & bottom border

 $2 \times 2" \times 47\frac{1}{2}"$  sides border

13 x 31/2" x 31/2" - block 1

156 x 11/2" x 11/2" - block 1

# From each of the fabrics 2, 3, 4 and 5 you need to cut

12 x 41/2" x 41/2" - block 2

# From fabric 6 cut

52 x 11/2" x 71/2" - block 1

52 x 11/2" x 71/2" - block 1

# From fabric 7 cut

2 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $47\frac{1}{2}$ " inner border top & bottom 2 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $45\frac{1}{2}$ " 12 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " - block 2 24 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " - block 2 52 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " - block 1

### From fabric 8 cut

96 x 21/2" x 21/2" - block 2

### Making up the blocks



**Block 1**. Lay out the fabric pieces as in the diagram. Stitch the sides strips of fabric 6 to the center square, Next sew a small square to each end of the fabric strip and stitch to your work. Keep working out in the same way until all the pieces are stitch to complete the block. You need 13 blocks in total.



Block 2.



Draw a diagonal line on the back of fabric 7. Stitch on the pencil line and trim a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on the outer edge of the stitch line. Now do the same to the

other corner as in the diagrams. Do the same to three corners, but look to see which corners you need to place your squares.

You now need to sew a narrow strip in between the two squares. Top and bottom pieces. Next stitch to the center strip top and bottom to complete the quilt. You need 12 blocks in total.

### Making up the quilt.

Lay out all the blocks as in the main diagram, Stitch the rows together, pressing the seams in the opposite way each time. This will help when sewing the rows together. Stitch the rows together to complete the quilt center.

## Borders

Sew the sides strips of fabric 7 to the quilt and then the top and bottom.

Now add the outer border of fabric1 as before sides and then the top and bottom to complete the quilt top.

# **Quilting and binding**

Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine a pattern to match the quilt.

Maybe flowers. Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

156 x 11/2" x 11/2" - block 1

# From each of the fabrics 2, 3, 4 and 5 you need to cut

12 x 41/2" x 41/2" - block 2

# From fabric 6 cut

52 x 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" - block 1

52 x 11/2" x 71/2" - block 1

# From fabric 7 cut

2 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $47\frac{1}{2}$ " inner border top & bottom 2 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $45\frac{1}{2}$ " 12 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " - block 2 24 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " - block 2 52 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " - block 1

### From fabric 8 cut

96 x 21/2" x 21/2" - block 2

### Making up the blocks

- 5. A886A Witches hats on ghostly grey fat  $\frac{1}{4}$
- 6. BB020 Brazilian orange <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>yd <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>m
- 7. BB030 Black 1/8yd 80cm
- 8. BB03 Light grey 5/8yd 1/2m

Wadding and backing 58" x 58"

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

## Cutting

### From fabric 1 cut

2 x 2" x 501/2" top & bottom border

2 x 2" x 47<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" sides border

13 x 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" - block 1

156 x 11/2" x 11/2" - block 1

# From each of the fabrics 2, 3, 4 and 5 you need to cut

12 x 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" - block 2

# From fabric 6 cut

52 x 11/2" x 71/2" - block 1

52 x 11/2" x 71/2" - block 1

# From fabric 7 cut

2 x 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 47<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" inner border top & bottom

2 x 1½" x 45½"

12 x 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 9<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" - block 2

24 x 11/2" x 41/2" - block 2

52 x 11/2" x 51/2" - block 1

### From fabric 8 cut

96 x 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" - block 2

#### Making up the blocks
