Fabrics from the Cosy Home collection: Requirements

1. A940A - Cosy home and garden on cream - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
2. A941B - Flower chains on cosy red - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 60cm
3. A942A - Little chequered cosy home light blue - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
4. A943B - Small cosy home hearts and flowers on warm grey - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
5. A944B - Cosy home sketchy stars warms and blue - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
6. A945C - Cosy home on dark blue - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 60cm
7. BBS3 - Autumn red - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 60cm
8. BB02 - Cream - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m

Wadding and backing 52" x52"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

6 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " H x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "W

6 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " W x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " H

From fabric 2 cut

6 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

16 x $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x $2\frac{5}{8}$ "

From fabric 3 cut

4 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " outer border

From fabric 4 cut

6 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

8 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 5 cut

4 x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

9 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

From fabric 6 cut

12 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

8 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 7 cut

8 x 1½" x 14½"

8 x 1½" x 12½"

From fabric 8 cut

2 x 1½" x 42½" inner border - top & bottom

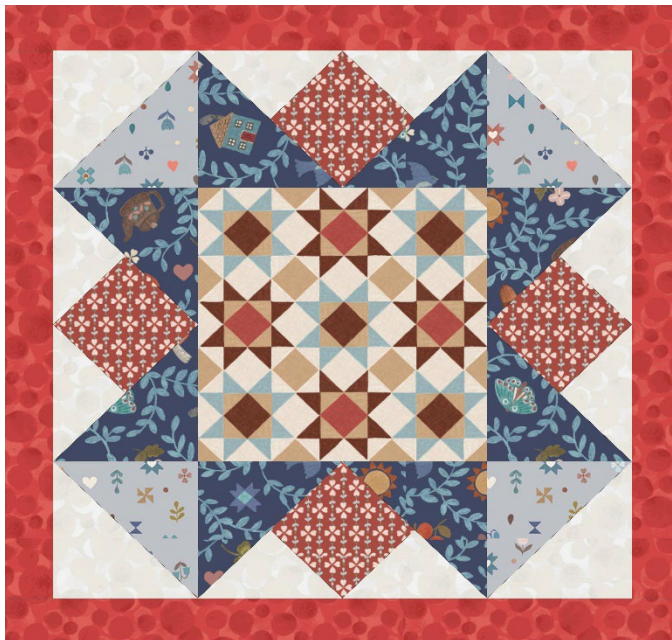
2 x 1½" x 40½" inner border - sides

8 x 4¼" x 4¼" cut in half diagonally twice

8 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once

4 x 2½" x 2½" corners

Making up the blocks



Block diagram

Lay out the fabric pieces for the block as in the diagram. Made up the corner squares by sewing the two small triangles together to make a larger triangle. Now sew the two triangles together to make a square.



Corner square $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " - Part block diagram $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

Part block.

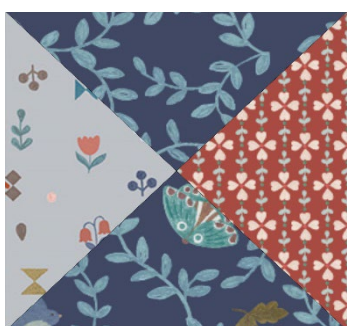
Now stitch a small triangle to each side of the square, press. Next sew the larger triangles to each side to complete this part of the block.

Lay out as in block diagram. Stitch in rows and then the rows together to complete the center of the block. Add the side strips, press and then top and bottom to the block. You need 4 in total.

Sashing blocks.



$4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ "

Diagram for block at each end of $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric 1 pieces.

Look at the main diagram for the layout of the fabrics. You will sew two small triangles together to make a larger triangle. Next stitch the two together to make a square.

Sew a square to each end for across the sashing and at the top and bottom for down the sashing as in the main diagram.

Making up the quilt.

Lay out the sashing strips and blocks as in the main diagram. Sew in rows starting with the sashing row at the top, press the seams in the opposite way each time as this will help when sewing the rows together.

The next row will be sashing and blocks. Next sew the rows together to complete the topper center.

Inner border.

Sew the side strips to the topper, press and then the top and bottom.

Outer border

On two of the strips for the outer border add a square to each end. I would do the top and bottom.

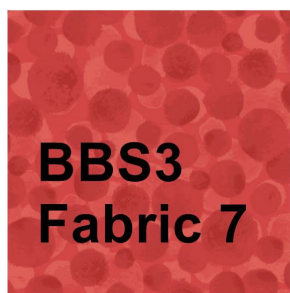
Stitch the other two strips on the sides of the topper. Sew the last two strips to the top and bottom to complete the topper.

Quilting and binding

Sandwich the table topper, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to size of table topper.

Use your favorite method from fabric 7 to bind the table topper.

3. A942C - Little chequered cosy home milk chocolate - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
4. A943A - Small cosy home hearts and flowers on cream - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
5. A944A - Cosy home sketchy stars blues - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
6. A945B - Cosy home on soft mustard - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 60cm
7. BBS9 - Multi blue - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 60cm
8. BB02 - Cream - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m

Wadding and backing 52" x52"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

6 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " H x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "W

6 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " W x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " H

From fabric 2 cut

6 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

16 x $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x $2\frac{5}{8}$ "

From fabric 3 cut

4 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " outer border

From fabric 4 cut

6 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

8 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 5 cut

4 x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

9 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

From fabric 6 cut

12 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

8 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 7 cut

8 x 1½" x 14½"

8 x 1½" x 12½"

From fabric 8 cut

2 x 1½" x 42½" inner border - top & bottom

2 x 1½" x 40½" inner border - sides

8 x 4¼" x 4¼" cut in half diagonally twice

8 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut in half diagonally once

4 x 2½" x 2½" corners

Making up the blocks



Block diagram

Lay out the fabric pieces for the block as in the diagram. Made up the corner squares by sewing the two small triangles together to make a larger triangle. Now sew the two triangles together to make a square.



Corner square $3\frac{1}{2}" \times 3\frac{1}{2}"$ - Part block diagram $3\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$

Part block.

Now stitch a small triangle to each side of the square, press. Next sew the larger triangles to each side to complete this part of the block.

Lay out as in block diagram. Stitch in rows and then the rows together to complete the center of the block. Add the side strips, press and then top and bottom to the block. You need 4 in total.

Sashing blocks.



$4\frac{1}{2}" \times 14\frac{1}{2}"$

Diagram for block at each end of $4\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$ fabric 1 pieces.

Look at the main diagram for the layout of the fabrics. You will sew two small triangles together to make a larger triangle. Next stitch the two together to make a square.

Sew a square to each end for across the sashing and at the top and bottom for down the sashing as in the main diagram.

Making up the quilt.

Lay out the sashing strips and blocks as in the main diagram. Sew in rows starting with the sashing row at the top, press the seams in the opposite way each time as this will help when sewing the rows together.

Inner border.

Sew the side strips to the topper, press and then the top and bottom.

Outer border

On two of the strips for the outer border add a square to each end. I would do the top and bottom.

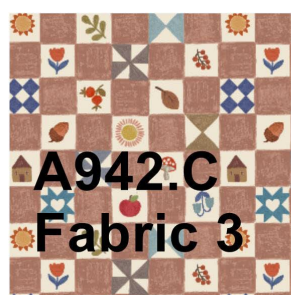
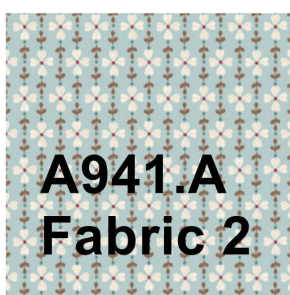
Stitch the other two strips on the sides of the topper. Sew the last two strips to the top and bottom to complete the topper.

Quilting and binding

Sandwich the table topper, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to size of table topper.

Use your favorite method from fabric 7 to bind the table topper.

4. A943C - Small cosy home hearts and flowers on dark blue - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
5. A944C - Cosy home sketchy stars warms and red - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
6. A945A - Cosy home on cream - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 60cm

Wadding and backing 52" x52"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

6 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " H x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "W

6 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " W x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " H

From fabric 2 cut

6 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

16 x $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x $2\frac{5}{8}$ "

From fabric 3 cut

4 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " outer border

From fabric 4 cut

6 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

8 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 5 cut

4 x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

9 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

From fabric 6 cut

12 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

8 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 7 cut

8 x 1½" x 14½"

8 x 1½" x 12½"

From fabric 8 cut

2 x 1½" x 42½" inner border - top & bottom

2 x 1½" x 40½" inner border - sides

8 x 4¼" x 4¼" cut in half diagonally twice

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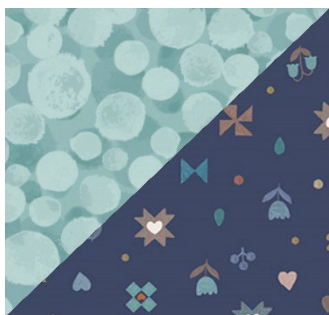
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Making up the blocks



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Part block.
