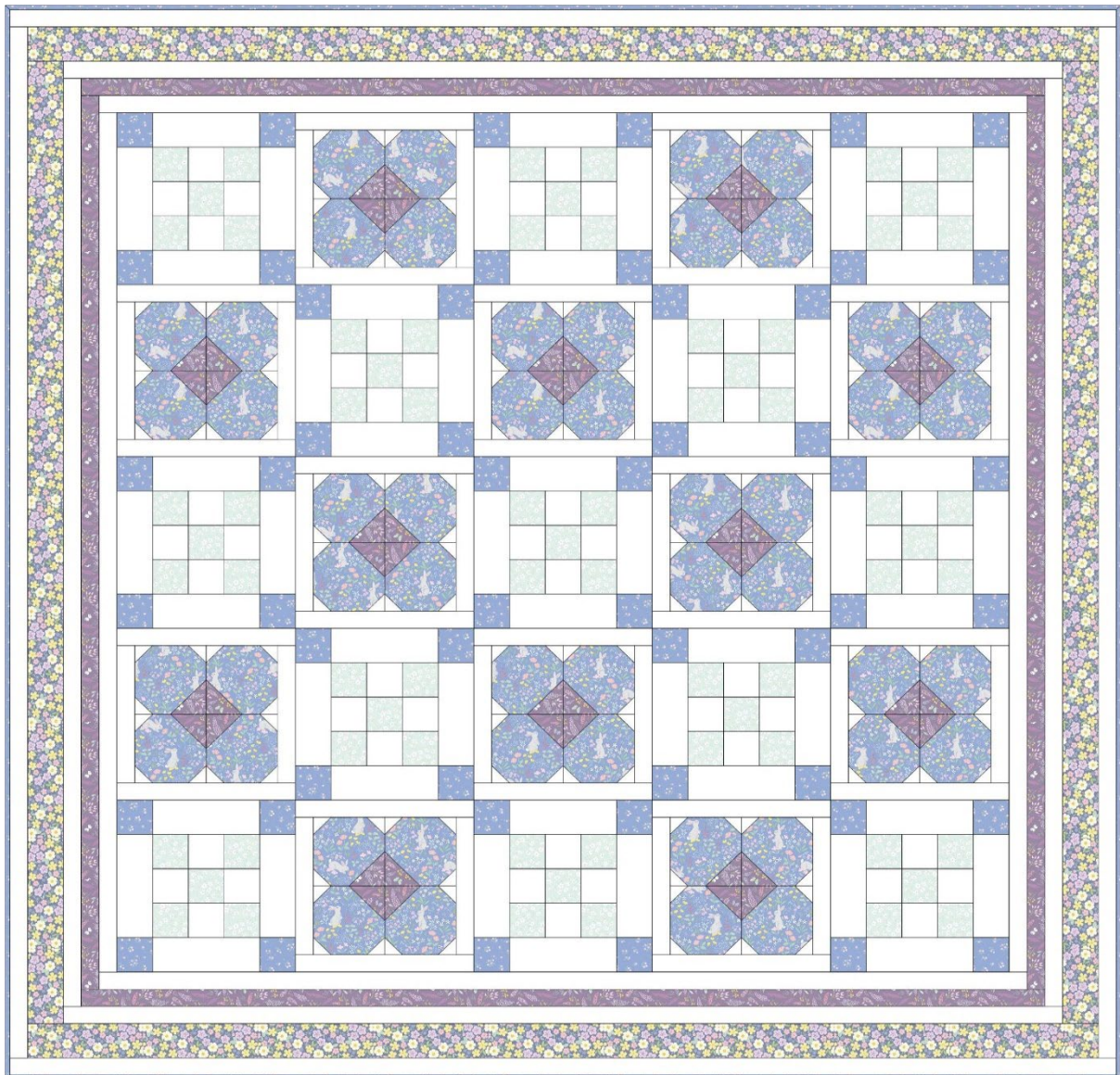

Quilt 1 - Size 62" x 62" - unfinished block size 10½" x 10½"



Main Diagram



Requirements

Fabrics from Dear Spring collection

1. CC66.2 - Chasing Tails - Dusky Mid Blue - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ m
2. CC67.3 - Spring Symphony- Dusky Dark Purple - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 60cm
3. CC68.3 - Primrose Prairie - Dusky Dark Blue - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
4. CC69.1 - Blossom by Blossom - Pale Turquoise $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
5. CC70.3 - Ditsy Dance- Dusky Mid Blue - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ m
6. Background fabric - $2\frac{5}{8}$ yd - $2\frac{1}{2}$ m

Wadding and backing 70" x 70"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

48 x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (block 2)

From fabric 2 cut

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $54\frac{1}{2}$ " border 2 (top & bottom)

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " border 2 (sides)

48 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (block 2)

From fabric 3 cut

2 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $60\frac{1}{2}$ " border 4 (top & bottom)

2 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " border 4 (sides)

From fabric 4 cut

65 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (block 1)

From fabric 5 cut

52 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (block 1)

From fabric 6 cut

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $62\frac{1}{2}$ " border 5 (top & bottom)

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $60\frac{1}{2}$ " border 5 (sides)

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " border 3 (top & bottom)

2 x 1½" x 52½" border 1 (top & bottom)

2 x 1½" x 50½" border 1 (sides)

52 x 2½" x 2½" (block 1)

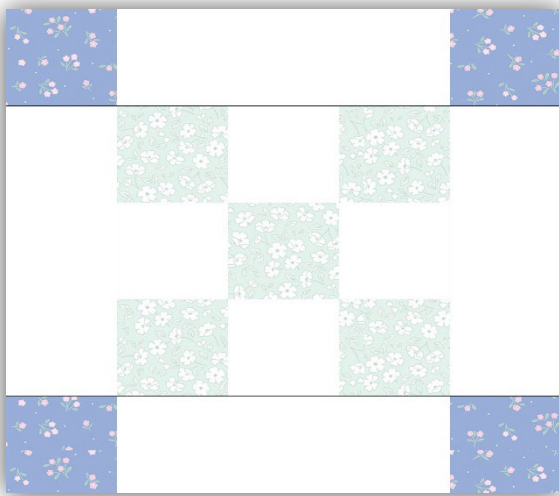
52 x 2½" x 6½" (block1)

148 x 1½" x 1½" (block 2)

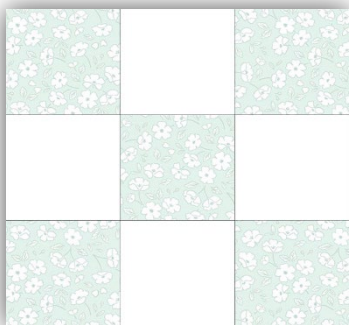
24 x 1½" x 8½" (Block 2)

24 x 1½" x 10½" (block 2)

Making up the blocks.

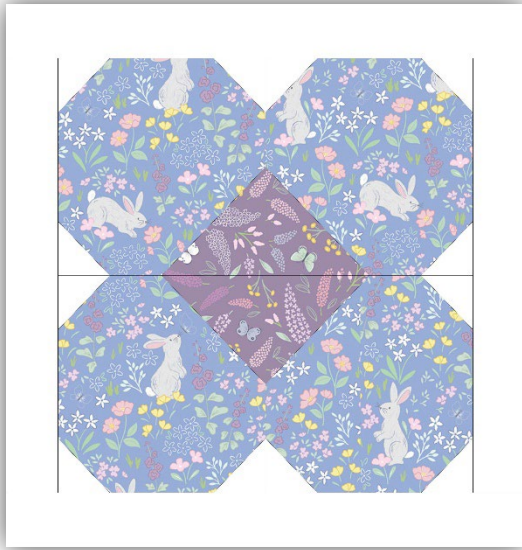


Block 1. Lay out the fabric pieces for the block. Make up the center by sewing the squares in row and then stitch the rows together,



Next add a strip of background fabric 2½" x 6½" to each side of the center part of the block. With the other two strips you will add a square to each end of the strip. Stitch to the top and bottom to complete the block.

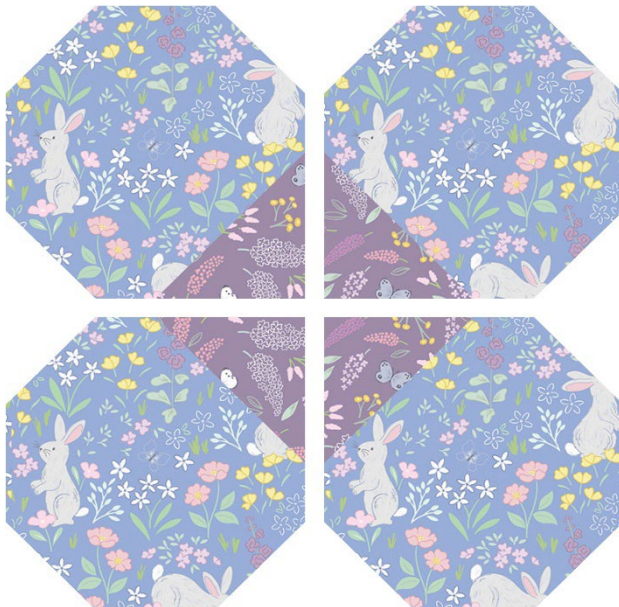
You need 13 in total.



Block 2.

The center part of the block is made up in the same way, but you need to place the squares in different corners. Three white square and one pattern for each of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " pattern square. On all of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " draw a diagonal line on the back of the square. Do the same with the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ "

of fabric 2. Place onto your $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " of fabric 1. Stitch just on the outer edge of the pencil line. Cut a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam from the pencil line on the outer edge. Do the same to all the other squares.



Sew the top two squares together and then do the same to the bottom two squares. Now stitch them together to make a square. Stitch the strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " to the sides and then add the top and bottom strips to complete the block.

You will have 12 blocks in total.

Borders.

Will need to join the fabric strips to get the length for the borders.

You have 5 borders on this quilt.

Stitch the sides and then the top and bottom each time, pressing as you go.

Quilting and binding

Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine a pattern to match the quilt.

Maybe flowers. Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 5 for binding the quilt
