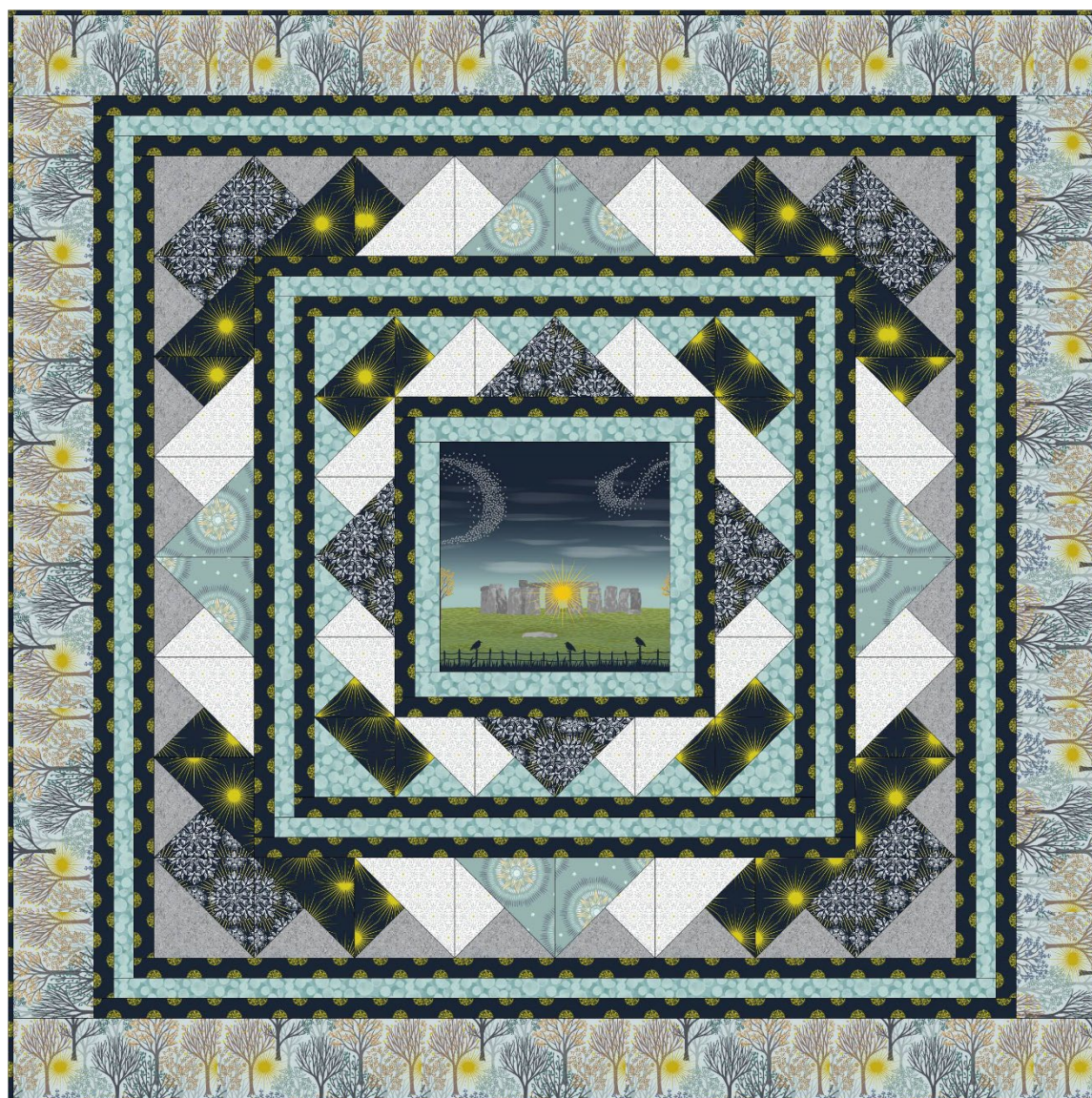

Main Diagram

Fabrics from Winter Solstice collection

Requirements

1. BB033 – Bumbleberries Duck Egg - 1yd - 1m
2. L53 - Stonehenge stripe - 1 stripe panel
3. L55 - Stone texture - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
4. L56A - Winter solstice tree on light sky - 1yd – 1m
5. L57A - Winter star grey on white - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
6. L58C - Winter star grey on white - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
7. L59C - Small solstice shining star on midnight blue - $1\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $1\frac{1}{2}$ m
8. L60A - Winter solstice sun star on Verdigris – Fat $\frac{1}{4}$ yard
9. L61C - Winter solstice flowers on midnight blue - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm

Wadding and backing 62" x 62"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

2 x $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #1 sides)

2 x $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x 14" (border #1 top & bottom)

1 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strip

Sub cut: 4 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " squares (cut diagonally twice - border #3)

2 x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

4 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $26\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #5 sides)

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $28\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #5 top & bottom)

4 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips (you might need to use some leftovers from border #5)

Sub cut: 2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #9 sides)

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $44\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #9 top & bottom)

From fabric 2 cut

1 x 11½" x 11½"

From fabric 3 cut

1 x 6¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 6 x 6¼" x 6¼" squares (cut diagonally twice)

1 x 5⅞" x WOF strip;

Sub cut: 2 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" squares (cut diagonally once)

From fabric 4 cut

5 x 4½" x WOF strips

Make: 2 x 4½" X 46½" (final side borders)

2 x 4½" X 54½" (final top & bottom borders)

From fabric 5 cut

1 x 6¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 2 x 6¼" x 6¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #7)

4 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

1 x 5¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 2 x 5¼" x 5¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #3)

4 x 4⅞" x 4⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

From fabric 6 cut

1 x 6¼" x WOF strip;

Sub cut: 2 x 6¼" x 6¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #7)

4 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

1 – x 5¼" x WOF strip;

Sub cut: 2 x 5¼ x 5¼ squares (cut diagonally twice - border #3)

2 x 4⅞" x 4⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

From fabric 7 cut

2 x 1¾" x 1¾" WOF strips;

Sub cut: 2 x 1¾" X 14" (border #2 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #2 top & bottom)

4 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #4 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #4 top & bottom)

4 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #6 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #6 top & bottom)

4 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips (use leftover fabric from previous strips to make border strips)

Make: 2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #10 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #10 top & bottom)

From fabric 8 cut

1 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 4 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

From fabric 9 cut

1 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips

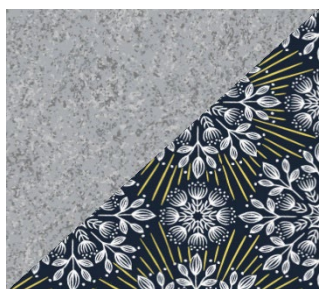
Sub cut: 2 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

1 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strip

Sub cut: 2 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares (cut diagonally twice - border #7)

4 x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

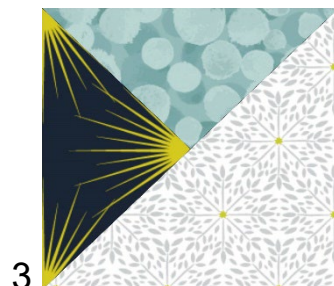
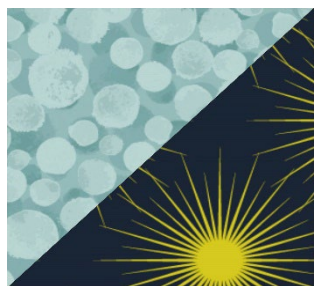
Making up the blocks



2 For border 7

Lay out the fabric pieces as in the main diagram. On block 1 you will stitch the two small triangles together to make a square. On block 2 you need to sew the two small triangles together and then stitch to the larger triangle to complete the block.

Do the same to all the other blocks. Set aside for now.



4. For border 3.

Make up in the same way as border 7 and set aside.

Making the throw

You will work from the center out as in the main diagram. **Border 1** sew the side strips to the center block, press. Next top and bottom.

Do the same to **border 2**. **Border 3** lay out the blocks as in the main diagram. Stitch the side blocks together and add to the throw. Do the same to the top and bottom blocks, but add a square to each end. Sew to the throw.

Border 4, 5 and 6. Sew the sides and then the top and bottom. One set at a time. **Border 7.** This will be made up the same way as border 3. Sides and then top and bottom. **Borders 8, 9 and 10.** Sew as before with your strips to complete the throw.

Quilting and binding

Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine a pattern to match the quilt.

Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 7 for binding the quilt.

Requirements

1. BB02 – Bumbleberries Cream - 1yd - 1m
2. L53 - Stonehenge stripe - 1 stripe
3. L54 - Winter solstice murmuration - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
4. L56B - Winter solstice trees on teal - 1yd – 1m
5. L57C - Winter star on midnight - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
6. L58B - Solstice sun on teal - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
7. L59A - Small solstice shining star on Verdigris - $1\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $1\frac{1}{2}$ m
8. L60B - Winter solstice sun star on grey – Fat $\frac{1}{4}$ yard
9. L61A - Winter solstice flowers on light sky - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm

Wadding and backing 62" x 62"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

2 x $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x $11\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #1 sides)

2 x $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x 14" (border #1 top & bottom)

1 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strip

Sub cut: 4 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " squares (cut diagonally twice - border #3)

2 x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

4 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $26\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #5 sides)

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $28\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #5 top & bottom)

4 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips (you might need to use some leftovers from border #5)

Sub cut: 2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #9 sides)

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $44\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #9 top & bottom)

From fabric 2 cut

1 x 11½" x 11½"

From fabric 3 cut

1 x 6¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 6 x 6¼" x 6¼" squares (cut diagonally twice)

1 x 5⅞" x WOF strip;

Sub cut: 2 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" squares (cut diagonally once)

From fabric 4 cut

5 x 4½" x WOF strips

Make: 2 x 4½" X 46½" (final side borders)

2 x 4½" X 54½" (final top & bottom borders)

From fabric 5 cut

1 x 6¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 2 x 6¼" x 6¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #7)

4 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

1 x 5¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 2 x 5¼" x 5¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #3)

4 x 4⅞" x 4⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

From fabric 6 cut

1 x 6¼" x WOF strip;

Sub cut: 2 x 6¼" x 6¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #7)

4 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

1 – x 5¼" x WOF strip;

Sub cut: 2 x 5¼ x 5¼ squares (cut diagonally twice - border #3)

2 x 4⅞" x 4⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

From fabric 7 cut

2 x 1¾" x 1¾" WOF strips;

Sub cut: 2 x 1¾" X 14" (border #2 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #2 top & bottom)

4 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #4 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #4 top & bottom)

4 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #6 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #6 top & bottom)

4 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips (use leftover fabric from previous strips to make border strips)

Make: 2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #10 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #10 top & bottom)

From fabric 8 cut

1 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 4 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

From fabric 9 cut

1 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

1 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strip

Sub cut: 2 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares (cut diagonally twice - border #7)

4 x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

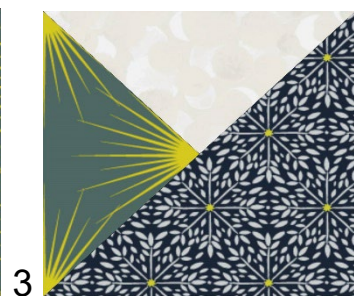
Making up the throw blocks



2 For border 7

Lay out the fabric pieces as in the main diagram. On block 1 you will stitch the two small triangles together to make a square. On block 2 you need to sew the two small triangles together and then stitch to the larger triangle to complete the block.

Do the same to all the other blocks. Set aside for now.



4. For border 3.

Make up in the same way as border 7 and set aside.

Making the throw

You will work from the center out as in the main diagram. **Border 1** sew the side strips to the center block, press. Next top and bottom.

Do the same to **border 2**. **Border 3** lay out the blocks as in the main diagram. Stitch the side blocks together and add to the throw. Do the same to the top and bottom blocks, but add a square to each end. Sew to the throw.

Border 4, 5 and 6. Sew the sides and then the top and bottom. One set at a time. **Border 7.** This will be made up the same way as border 3. Sides and then top and bottom. **Borders 8, 9 and 10.** Sew as before with your strips to complete the throw.

Quilting and binding

Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine a pattern to match the quilt.

Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 7 for binding the quilt.

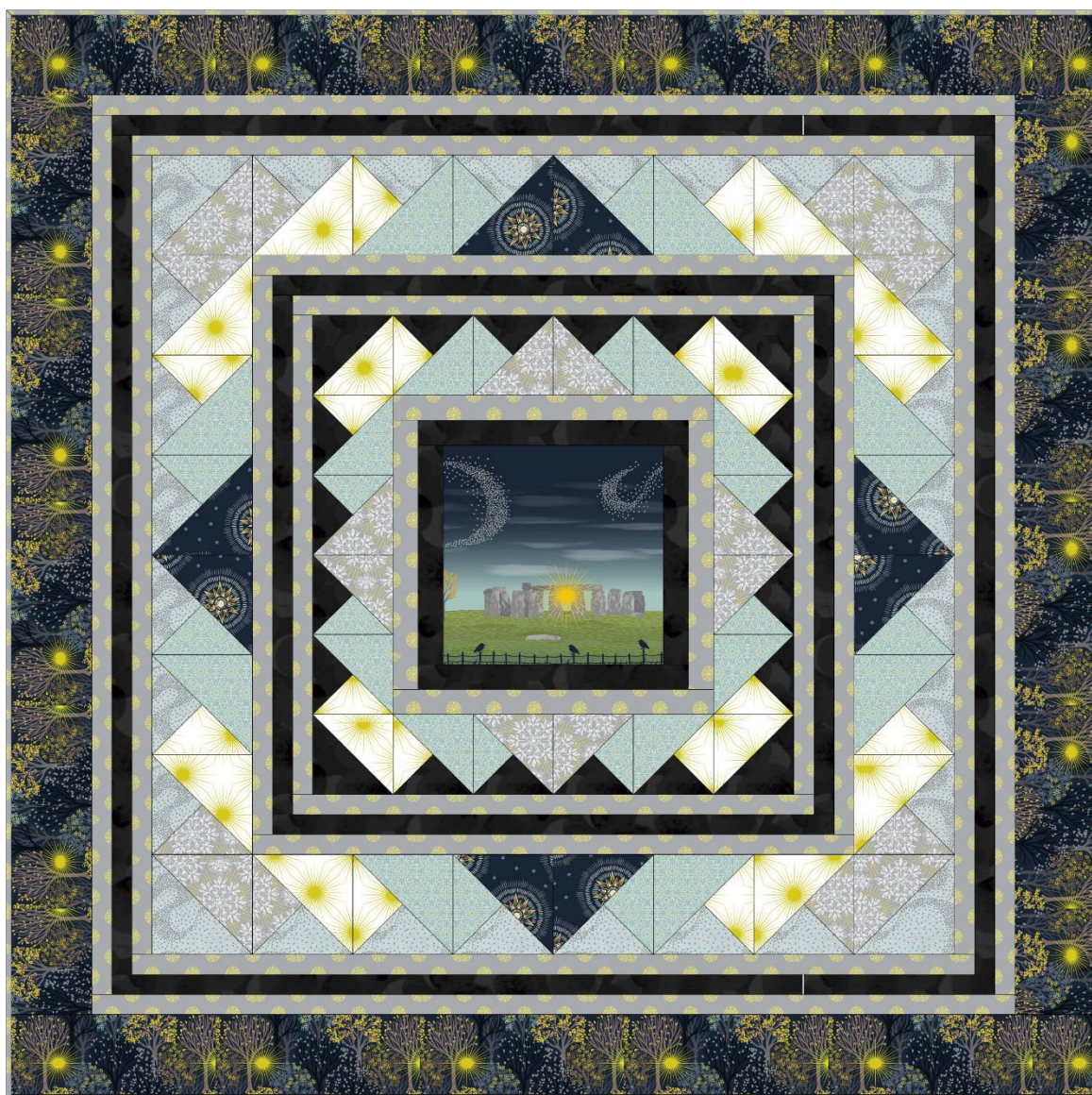

2. L53 - Stonehenge stripe - 1 stripe
3. L54 - Winter solstice murmuration - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
4. L56C - Winter solstice trees on midnight blue - 1yd – 1m
5. L57B - Winter star on Verdigris - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
6. L58A - Solstice sun on white - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
7. L59B - Small solstice shining star on grey - 1½yd - 1½m
8. L60C - Winter solstice sun star on midnight blue – Fat $\frac{1}{4}$ yard
9. L61B - Winter solstice flowers grey - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm

Wadding and backing 62" x 62"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

2 x 1¾" x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 1¾" x 11½" (border #1 sides)

2 x 1¾" x 14" (border #1 top & bottom)

1 x 5¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 4 x 5¼" x 5¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #3)

2 x 4⅞" x 4⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

4 x 1½" x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 1½" x 26½" (border #5 sides)

2 x 1½" x 28½" (border #5 top & bottom)

4 x 1½" x WOF strips (you might need to use some leftovers from border #5)

Sub cut: 2 x 1½" x 42½" (border #9 sides)

2 x 1½" x 44½" (border #9 top & bottom)

From fabric 2 cut

1 x 11½" x 11½"

From fabric 3 cut

1 x 6¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 6 x 6¼" x 6¼" squares (cut diagonally twice)

1 x 5⅞" x WOF strip;

Sub cut: 2 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" squares (cut diagonally once)

From fabric 4 cut

5 x 4½" x WOF strips

Make: 2 x 4½" X 46½" (final side borders)

2 x 4½" X 54½" (final top & bottom borders)

From fabric 5 cut

1 x 6¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 2 x 6¼" x 6¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #7)

4 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

1 x 5¼" x WOF strip

Sub cut: 2 x 5¼" x 5¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #3)

4 x 4⅞" x 4⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

From fabric 6 cut

1 x 6¼" x WOF strip;

Sub cut: 2 x 6¼" x 6¼" squares (cut diagonally twice - border #7)

4 x 5⅞" x 5⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

1 – x 5¼" x WOF strip;

Sub cut: 2 x 5¼ x 5¼ squares (cut diagonally twice - border #3)

2 x 4⅞" x 4⅞" squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

From fabric 7 cut

2 x 1¾" x 1¾" WOF strips;

Sub cut: 2 x 1¾" X 14" (border #2 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #2 top & bottom)

4 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #4 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #4 top & bottom)

4 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #6 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #6 top & bottom)

4 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips (use leftover fabric from previous strips to make border strips)

Make: 2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #10 sides)

2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (border #10 top & bottom)

From fabric 8 cut

1 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 4 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

From fabric 9 cut

1 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips

Sub cut: 2 x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #3)

1 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strip

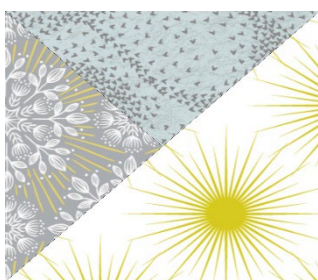
Sub cut: 2 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares (cut diagonally twice - border #7)

4 x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares (cut diagonally once - border #7)

Making up the throw blocks

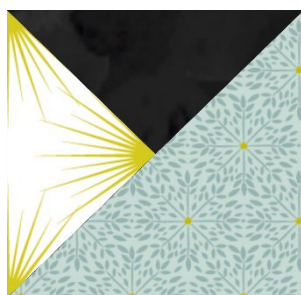
2 For border 7

Lay out the fabric pieces as in the main diagram. On block 1 you will stitch the two small triangles together to make a square. On block 2 you need to sew the two small triangles together and then stitch to the larger triangle to complete the block.

Do the same to all the other blocks. Set aside for now.

4. For border 3.

Make up in the same way as border 7 and set aside.

Making the throw

You will work from the center out as in the main diagram. **Border 1** sew the side strips to the center block, press. Next top and bottom.

Do the same to **border 2**. **Border 3** lay out the blocks as in the main diagram. Stitch the side blocks together and add to the throw. Do the same to the top and bottom blocks, but add a square to each end. Sew to the throw.

Border 4, 5 and 6. Sew the sides and then the top and bottom. One set at a time. **Border 7.** This will be made up the same way as border 3. Sides and then top and bottom. **Borders 8, 9 and 10.** Sew as before with your strips to complete the throw.

Quilting and binding

Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine a pattern to match the quilt.

Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 7 for binding the quilt.



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
